## Iwi Radio Coverage

Māori radio station signals can be accessed from Kaitaia in the North, to Wellington in the South, from Kaikoura to Christchurch, including Dunedin and Invercargill. While there are some areas that have no access to Māori radio, the vast majority of Māori people can receive at least one Māori radio station signal. <i>Station</i>	<i>Primary Broadcast Area</i>
<b>Awa FM</b> Wanganui (100FM, 91.2FM, 93.5FM)	The Awa FM frequency can be accessed throughout the Whanganui and Rangitikei districts. The signal can be received as far south as Bulls and Marton, and as far north as Ohakune. This area includes Kaiwi, Whangaehu, Rata, Ratana, Raetihi, Turakina, Whanganui and other small settlements situated along the Whanganui river. Awa FM also broadcasts into Taumarunui.
<b>Kia Ora FM</b> Palmerston North (89.8FM)	Palmerston North, Sanson, Bulls, Dannevirke, Woodville, Eketahuna, Pahiatua, Foxton, Feilding
<b>Moana AM</b> Tauranga (1440AM) <b>Tahi FM</b> [Rangatahi] Tauranga (98.2FM)	Extends from Tauranga city and covers Mt Maunganui, Papamoa Beach, Maketū, Te Puke and Katikati (...actual frequency can also be received as far East as Whakatāne and even Te Kaha).
<b>Ngā Iwi FM</b> Paeroa (99.5FM, 92.2FM)	Includes Paeroa, Thames, Thames Coast (up to Kereta), Waihi, Ngatea, the surrounding Hauraki Plains, and parts of Huntly.
<b>Ngāti Hine FM</b> Whangarei (99.5FM, 96.4FM)	Whangarei & surrounding areas (...although signal can be accessed both to the North and South of Whangarei.)
<b>Pumanawa FM</b> Rotorua (89FM)	Covers the general city area of Rotorua. The frequency cannot be received past the turn off to state highway 30, north east of Rotorua, or state highway 5 north of Ngongotaha
<b>Radio Kahungunu</b> Napier/Hastings (765AM, 94.3FMP)	Stretches from the Māhia Peninsula in the north, through to the township of Dannevirke in the south. This frequency area includes the cities of Napier and Hastings, and also the townships of Nuhaka, Mohaka, Wairoa, Te Hauke, Te Aute, Waipawa, Otane, Waipukurau, Bridge Pa, Clive, Omahu, Bayview, Potaka, Pakipaki and Waimarama. There is a strong argument that the actual frequency area is much larger than this.
<b>Radio Maniapoto</b> Te Kuiti (91.9FM, 92.7FM, 96.5FM, 99.6FM)	Signal can be accessed from Kawhia and Te Awamutu in the north, to Bennydale and Poipoi in the south. This area includes Otorohanga and Te Kuiti.

<i>Station</i>	<i>Primary Broadcast Area</i>
<b>Radio Ngāti Porou</b> Ruatoria/East Coast (585AM, 90.1FM, 93.3FM, 98.1FM)	Stretches from Hicks Bay in the north through to the city of Gisborne. This frequency area includes Te Araroa, Tikitiki, Ruatoria, Te Puia Springs, Waipiro Bay, Tokomaru Bay and Tolaga Bay. The station can also be received in Matawai, but only in selected areas
<b>Radio Tainui</b> Ngaruawahia (95.4FM, 96.3FM, 96.5FM)	Covers the Hamilton and Ngaruawahia areas. The frequency can be received as far north as Huntly, and south to Te Awamutu. This area includes Morrinsville, Cambridge and across the Hauraki Plains.
<b>Radio Waatea</b> Auckland (603AM)	Covers the greater Auckland, stretching from Whangaparoa to the Bombay hills (... frequency can also be received as far North as Kaikohe, and south into Waikato and Taranaki)
<b>Raukawa FM</b> Tokoroa (90.6FM, 95.7FM)	Includes the settlements of Tokoroa, Mangakino, Matamata, Te Aroha, Cambridge, Karapiro, Tirau and Putaruru
<b>Sun FM</b> [Te Reo Irirangi o Mānuka Tutahi] Whakatane (98.4FM, 96.9FM)	Signal can be accessed across the Eastern Bay of Plenty. The frequency can be received in Whakatane, Ohope, Taneatua, Ruatoki, Kawerau, Kutarere, Edgecumbe, Thorndon, Matata and Murupara.
<b>Tahu FM</b> Christchurch, Dunedin, Invercargill, Kaikoura, Timaru, Hokitika, Sky Digital 105 90.5FM, 95FM, 99.6FM, 91.1FM, 89.1FM, 97.3FM	Signal can be accessed through out the south island, from Kaikoura in the north to Taitapu, just south of Christchurch. The station also broadcasts into Dunedin and Invercargill on separate signals.  Tahu FM can also be accessed nationwide on its Sky TV channel.
<b>Tautoko FM</b> Mangamuka Bridge (90.8FM, 98.2FM)	Signal can be accessed from the Mangamuka gorge in the north, through to Whangarei in the south. This area includes Kaikohe, Waitangi, Pahia, Russell and a number of other small Northland communities. Whangarei has not been included as part of Tautoko FM's primary broadcast area
<b>Te Hiku o Te Ika</b> Kaitaia (94.4FM) <b>Tai FM</b> [Rangatahi] Kaitaia (92FM)	Covers the Far North of the North Island. While the frequency can be received from the Mangamuka ranges to the North Cape.  The station actually broadcasts three different frequencies under the Te Hiku o te Ika band. There is Te Hiku, Sunshine and Tai.
<b>Te Korimako o Taranaki</b> New Plymouth (94.8FM)	Signal can be accessed from Patea in the south through to Mokau in the north, and inland to Ohura. This area includes Waitara, Inglewood, Stratford, Eltham, Hawera, Oakura and the city of New Plymouth.
<b>Te Upoko o Te Ika</b> Wellington (1161AM)	Signal can be accessed through out the Wellington region and north into Horowhenua, Manawatu, Wanganui and southern Taranaki
<b>Turanga FM</b> [Te Reo Irirangi o Turanganui-a-Kiwa] Gisborne (91.7FM, 95.5FM)	Stretches from Whangara in the north to Mahia and Wairoa in the south. This includes Gisborne city, Matawhero, Manutuke and Matawai
<b>Tūwharetoa FM</b> Turangi (97.2FM)	Signal can be accessed from Waiouru in the south through to Taupo in the north. This area includes Turangi, National Park, Waitahanui, Tokanu, Waihi and Taumarunui.
